Chairperson and CEO Report

There is an old adage that says “the only constant in life is change.” This has certainly been the case for the Boys and Girls Clubs of Winnipeg (BGCW) in 2013, as we have responded to the need to grow. The most significant of these changes was moving our administrative office from our long-standing location on Main Street to the third floor of 61 Juno Street. The culmination of an almost six year process, our new office gives us much more space and an enhanced capacity to facilitate meetings and training opportunities.

One of the immediate impacts of our move to Juno Street was partnering with the Rogers Youth Fund to build a second Tech Centre in support of our Rogers Raising the Grade Program. This compliments the first Rogers site at our Freight House Club, and has increased the numbers of youth we engage with through our after-school education programs. During the day we are able to also use the Tech Centre to facilitate the Personal Employment Program, supporting inner-city residents ages 18-29 to find employment. This new space has been a very positive development for both programs.

Our largest program also saw changes in 2013. A new site was added to the CSI Summer Program at Lord Selkirk School, bringing the total up to 16 schools in two school divisions. Over 1,000 elementary school students enrolled in the five week program, engaging in educational activities they otherwise would not have had access to.

Another positive change for our organization in 2013 was the addition of Capital One Race for Kids to the roster of fundraisers we host. This unique event is in partnership with Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada and is held on the same day across Canada. Race for Kids had a great debut in Winnipeg and looks like it will be even stronger in 2014.

Even though things are consistently changing at Boys and Girls Clubs of Winnipeg there is one constant that allows us to do the work we do. That is the support we receive on an ongoing basis. We are able to grow thanks to our funders, corporate partners, donors, volunteers and staff. It is because of you that we can continue to do what is most important - improve the lives of Winnipeg children, youth and their families.

Sports and Recreation

The Sports and Recreation program promotes physical fitness, participation in sports, positive use of leisure time and the development of social and interpersonal skills. Physical activity offers many benefits around mental and physical health and is essential in the overall well-being of our members.

This year we partnered with a number of amazing organizations to provide unique experiences for BGCW members. These included the chance to hold the Canadian flag at a Winnipeg Blue Bombers football game thanks to Tim Hortons and an opportunity to meet Jonathan Toews thanks to Canadian Tire Jumpstart.

Through YAA, over 65 kids are rolling thanks to donated bikes from Headingly Correctional Centre and bike helmets from IMPACT and Kid Sport Winnipeg. Helmet safety training was provided through the Coalition of Active and Safe Kids of Manitoba. W.R.E.N.C.H. provided bike safety presentations and adjusted each bike to fit each child correctly.

Johnson Waste Management held the BGCW Invitational Basketball Tournament for the second year, providing a great weekend full of fun and talent and a new pair of basketball shoes for participating members. This year's event included a partnership with the University of Manitoba's Bison basketball team, with players providing Club members with a skills clinic and an opportunity for kids to scrimmage with players.



"I like to play basketball here and do arts and crafts. I also like Girls Night Out. My favourite activity is skating. Actually, I like all winter activities!

Because of playing basketball at BGCW, I now play guard on my school's basketball team. It's also nice that I get to hang out with my friends.

It's important for kids to come to BGCW because there's lots of fun stuff you can do that you've never done before. I tried so many different things that I've never even heard of before! It's so fun to come here."

Arts and Cultural Appreciation

The Arts and Cultural Appreciation program allows children and youth to develop creativity and cultural awareness through participation in cultural experiences, creating visual arts and crafts and exposure to the performing arts. Critical thinking and creativity flourishes when children and youth can express their own thoughts and feelings.

This program grew in many ways this year, including expanding the musical mentorship program to our Freight House Club with the help of singer songwriter Sheena Grobb and delivering multimedia and performing arts at our Sister MacNamara Club thanks to a generous grant through the Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada.

Rogers Raising the Grade offered a fun and creative summer program in partnership with Freeze Frame Manitoba. Youth aged 13-16 created animated films and film documentaries over a two week period with the help of some very talented local artists. This program built up participants' storytelling, writing and technical skills while gaining a deeper understanding of the filmmaking process.



Musical Mentors

The Musical Mentors program through Winnipeg Folk Festival pairs mentors with groups of high-school age youth to explore music in different ways. Participants were able to interact with professional musicians and learn how music is made.

The goal of this initiative is to bring music to youth who do not have access to sophisticated music programs. Some of the participants attend classes at schools with no music programs at all.

Groups met weekly to work collaboratively on songwriting, instrumentation and development of live performance skills. We were very fortunate to have Juno award winner Keri Latimer continue to work with our Gilbert Park Club along with Sheena Grobb.

Each group worked towards a final project—live performance, recorded song, or another original project decided upon by the group.

Education and Career Development



The Education and Career Development program helps youth to develop skills, knowledge and an attitude that will help them in school and employment. The profound impact of education improves outcomes for the children and youth we serve and equips them with the insights and critical thinking skills they need to achieve their goals.

With the addition of Lord Selkirk School in Elmwood, the CSI Program expanded to 15 sites in 2013, allowing us to serve over 1,000 kids during the 5-week program, combating summer learning loss and narrowing the opportunity gap.

September 25, 2013 was Rogers Youth Education Day - a day to celebrate youth and learning and shine a light on the importance of education and its ability to change young lives and communities for the better. BGCW members had a great time hamming it up on Breakfast Television helping to deliver programming on-air and in-studio, while sharing information about Rogers Youth Fund, their Club and their personal experiences.

To further encourage childhood literacy, a reading program was formed at our Sister MacNamara Club for Power Up! The kids come together and discuss the books they read and vote for their favourite. The author with the most votes from across the province wins a Manitoba Young Readers Choice Award.



"Power Up! is an after-school program for students to get homework help. Our job is to create literacy and numeracy-based activities for them to participate in. Anything to get them involved in learning through fun activities!

After school programs ensure learning is positive. It's so important that kids are taking part in such strong activities that aid in their development. A student might not want help in math, but may be willing to participate in fun activities that contain math elements. BGCW allow members to practice their new knowledge without really having to look at it as work."

Health Awareness and Life Skills Development

The Health Awareness and Life Skills Development program develops young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviour that nurtures their own well-being, set personal goals, and acquire the skills to live successfully as self-sufficient adults. Our proactive approach in addressing the issues young people face provides opportunities for them to develop practical skills for their future.

Cooking programs are a great interactive way to teach youth about healthy eating habits while having fun and learning practical new skills. In partnership with Winnipeg Harvest, a cooking club was offered to the members of both our Norquay and Freight House Clubs this year, using their kitchen facilities to cook and learn about nutrition. Through a partnership with Food Matters Manitoba we were also able to deliver a cooking club for our Aberdeen Club members.

Nursing students from the University of Manitoba held a series of various clinics at our Gilbert Park Club over a period of nine weeks, covering health and wellness topics such as hand washing and personal hygiene, illness prevention and dental health. The kids especially liked applying the Glo Germ powder to their hands to see where they missed!



Caregiving Skills for Youth

Thanks to a grant from The Winnipeg Foundation and the South Winnipeg Family Information Centre (SWFIC) our Clubs will be able to deliver babysitting courses to members aged 12 and over.

The program is designed to instill confidence and empower youth by providing comprehensive instruction around topics such as accident prevention, basic first aid procedures and how to deal with illnesses and other problems that may occur.

The grant covered the cost of training our staff so they could teach club members the course as well as providing the manuals and supplies needed at no cost to our organization.





Leadership and Service to Community

The Leadership and Service to Community program empowers youth to support and influence their club and community, sustain meaningful relationships with others, develop a positive self-image, participate in the democratic process and respect their own and others cultural identities. Equipping young people with the skills and knowledge to lead will be one of the most valuable assets they take with them as they grow.

Our Club members had many opportunities to showcase their leadership skills this year, from selling Christmas cards as a fundraiser for BGCW to rubbing elbows with Canada's most influential politicians for YOUTH in Office.

One of our Ryerson Club alumni, Jessica, was asked to participate in the World According to Us launch in Toronto, a platform for young people to express what they feel is important to them. As part of a panel she was able to speak about issues that mattered to her.

In June, BGCW recognized our amazing youth volunteers with a fun-filled day at FortWhyte Alive that included a barbecue, games, canoeing and a scavenger hunt before presenting certificates to all the incredible young people who give of their time throughout the year. Youth had the opportunity to meet other youth from across the city, share new experiences, reflect and talk about interests for the future leadership development at BGCW.



On his friend's advice, Kuch started attending our Sister MacNamara Club when he was 16. Initially he came to play basketball but ended up getting so much more out of his time, eventually becoming an activity worker for the same Club.

This year, Kuch found himself at Parliament Hill advocating for youth with some of Canada's top political players. In November, he went to Ottawa to spend time with Nikki Ashton, MP for Churchill during YOUTH in Office through Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada. During his

trip he met other MPs, toured Parliament Hill, and even experienced Parliament in session at the House of Commons.

Other Programs and Services

BGCW offers a variety of additional programs from our administration office that work to provide supports and opportunities to specific youth populations in Winnipeg.

VOICES - Manitoba's Youth in Care

Through youth-driven advocacy and public education, Voices provides support, encouragement and community to youth-in-care and youth-from-care. Their goal is to raise awareness of the challenges of life in the child welfare system, as well as to improve conditions for those in care.

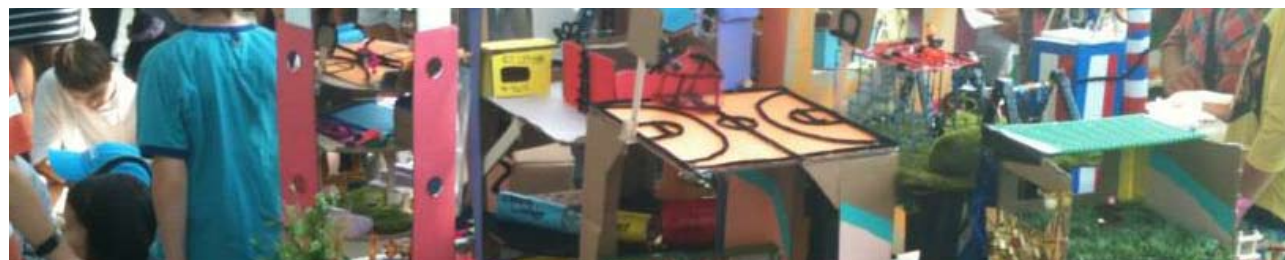
One way Voices members learned how to make their voices heard was through the Multimedia Advocacy, Sacred Stories, Innovative Voices Experience (MASSIVE). This week-long multimedia workshop taught participants how to share their stories safely and strategically and how to use their voice and experiences to create a better system of care in Manitoba.

Voices also put on a garbage bag fashion show at the Graffiti Gallery, featuring art and fashion by youth in and from care. Youth in care have had their personal belongings thrown into black garbage bags for generations - this fashion show aimed to raise awareness around the importance of transitions while in care.

Youth Agencies Alliance (YAA)

BGCW is a founding member of the Youth Agencies Alliance, a group of 18 youth serving agencies that work together to address the issues of at-risk youth. Formed in 1995, YAA provides many joint projects and programs that benefit children and youth.

Approximately 160 youth from YAA collaborated on a diorama of their ideal version of Winnipeg titled My Winnipeg: A diorama for youth. Workshops were led by YAA members Art City and Graffiti Art Programming. This program was made possible with the support from United Way of Winnipeg, The Winnipeg Foundation, Winnipeg Richardson International Airport and Rotary Club of Winnipeg. The resulting project was an exciting, often unheard perspective of how younger generations would shape their city. The completed artwork was on display in Mayor Sam Katz' office, the Millennium Library and the Winnipeg Richardson International Airport.



Capital One Race for Kids™

On June 1, 2013, BGCW participated in our first Capital One Race for Kids™, held at The Forks in Winnipeg. In this urban adventure race, teams of four competed in a series of 10 themed checkpoints.

With 24 participating teams, BGCW ranked first place in participant engagement for a first year event and fourth overall out of all 20 cities participating across Canada.

To kick off the event, a media launch with Virgin Radio, Breakfast Television, CTV and SHAW took place at the Forks Market on April 15, 2013. Media, BGCW staff and alumni participated in a simulation of the event and Mick E Moose of the Winnipeg Jets represented us in a national video production that was posted to YouTube and Boys and Girls Clubs websites across Canada.

A special thanks to our volunteers from MTS, Needs Centre, WRHA Employees, Manitoba Geocaching Association Members, Students and BGCW Employees, making our first year a success!

2013 Highlights

We get by with a little help from our friends! BGCW was fortunate to partner with a number of compassionate individuals and organizations on events and projects throughout the year. These are just a few of the incredible supporters working to help Winnipeg's young people reach their full potential.

Growing a Healthy Partnership with Shelmerdine

Shelmerdine Garden Centre held two holiday fundraising campaigns for BGCW this year - a Halloween Fun Zone and a Christmas Photo Spot - together raising \$6,000 for BGCW!

The indoor Halloween Fun Zone featured a hay maze, tire swings, zip lines, face-painting and more, with donations benefitting BGCW. The Christmas Photo Spot featured Santa's sleigh and reindeers with a volunteer Santa and Mrs. Claus on weekends. Professional photos were emailed to customers with proceeds going to BGCW.

In addition to these fundraisers, Shelmerdine Garden Centre also delivered an endless supply of mulch, landscaping cloth, plants, scrubs and seeds for the Youth for Ecological Action Garden projects. The scope of these donations made it possible to improve three huge community gardens engaging BGCW youth interns and community volunteers. The gardens are maintained and harvested in partnership with the surrounding community.

Impacting Lives of Children with Kevin Betzold of GNR Camping World

Kevin Betzold started out his career as an educator and his journey took a different turn as life sometimes does. He is currently the co-owner of GNR Camping World. Through his philanthropic work at BGCW, Kevin is impacting lives of children so they can have more tools, skills and resources to advance to a greater quality of life.

Kevin has been a long-time ally of BGCW, acting as a Volunteer Committee member and sponsor for the Harvest Classic Golf Tournament from 2007 to 2013, serving on our Board of Directors since 2009, encouraging many businesses to become BGCW supporters.

GNR Camping World is a family driven business and believes that if kids are given the resources and supports to thrive, they will. To that end, GNR Camping World is a leading sponsor for our annual 100-Mile Dinner and Hot Sauce fundraiser, raising much needed funds for BGCW Clubs and programs.

Creating Holiday Memories with WestJet and MacDon Industries

WestJet sponsored and volunteered at our Gilbert Park Club Kids Holiday Season Party and the Family Holiday Dinner at Northwood Community Centre. The WestJet employee volunteers generously gave of their time shopping and wrapping gifts, assembling loot bags, assisting at activity stations at the children's party and serving up dinner at the family feast, brightening the spirits of 200 children and their families.

United Way of Winnipeg Day of Caring

WRHA employee volunteers have generously participated in an annual United Way Day of Caring for BGCW since 2009. The event has taken the form of a Family Feast for children, youth and their families in the Central Community area. Families can participate in craft activities, have the opportunity for a family portrait, and are served a hot buffet turkey dinner by WRHA employees.

The annual event has grown in attendance to 230 last year from 170 in 2009. Where some organizations struggle to engage parents, the WRHA team has built bridges so children, their parents and grandparents can enjoy a traditional meal.

Education Students Provide Valuable Mentorship Service

Over the past six years, the University of Winnipeg Department of Education Service Learning program has placed over 300 students to serve with BGCW, for a total of over 12,000 hours at our Clubs.

Power Up! is just one of the programs where students have been placed to complete Service Learning hours for course credit. Students act as mentors for children and youth in after school academic enrichment, sports, leadership, life skill, art and drop in programs.

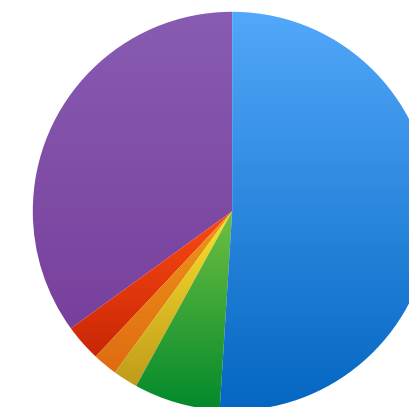

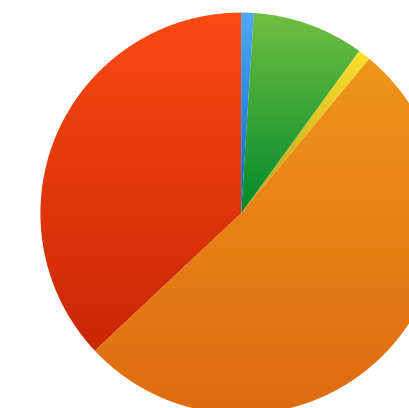
Excess of Revenues over Expenses 260,533
