# Chairperson and CEO Report

On the surface, our impact seems like an easy thing to measure. Our statistics will tell you how many children and youth participated in our programs and utilized our services over the course of this past year. The question then is, does that define the impact that Boys and Girls Clubs of Winnipeg has in the communities we work in?

One of the best ways to answer this is to ask the youth and their families who come through our doors--why do you come to our Clubs?

The answers might be as you would expect. We hear responses like "I can play with my friends after school," or "there is always something good to eat." Some answers, however, might surprise you. "I come because it helps improve my grades in school," or "I feel safe while I am at the Boys and Girls Clubs" would not be replies you expect to hear very often. The lesson we have learned in our 39 years of operation is that our impact in the community can be as unique as the child or teenager who chooses to spend a part of their day with us.

There is one area of impact that is much easier for our organization to measure and that is how the community's continued support allows us to do the work that we do. In simple terms, without the help we receive from funders, donors, and corporate partners, we would not exist. The same can be said for the efforts of our staff and volunteers. On a daily basis, we see how their work has a positive impact on our youth and ensures that our Clubs are "a good place to be."

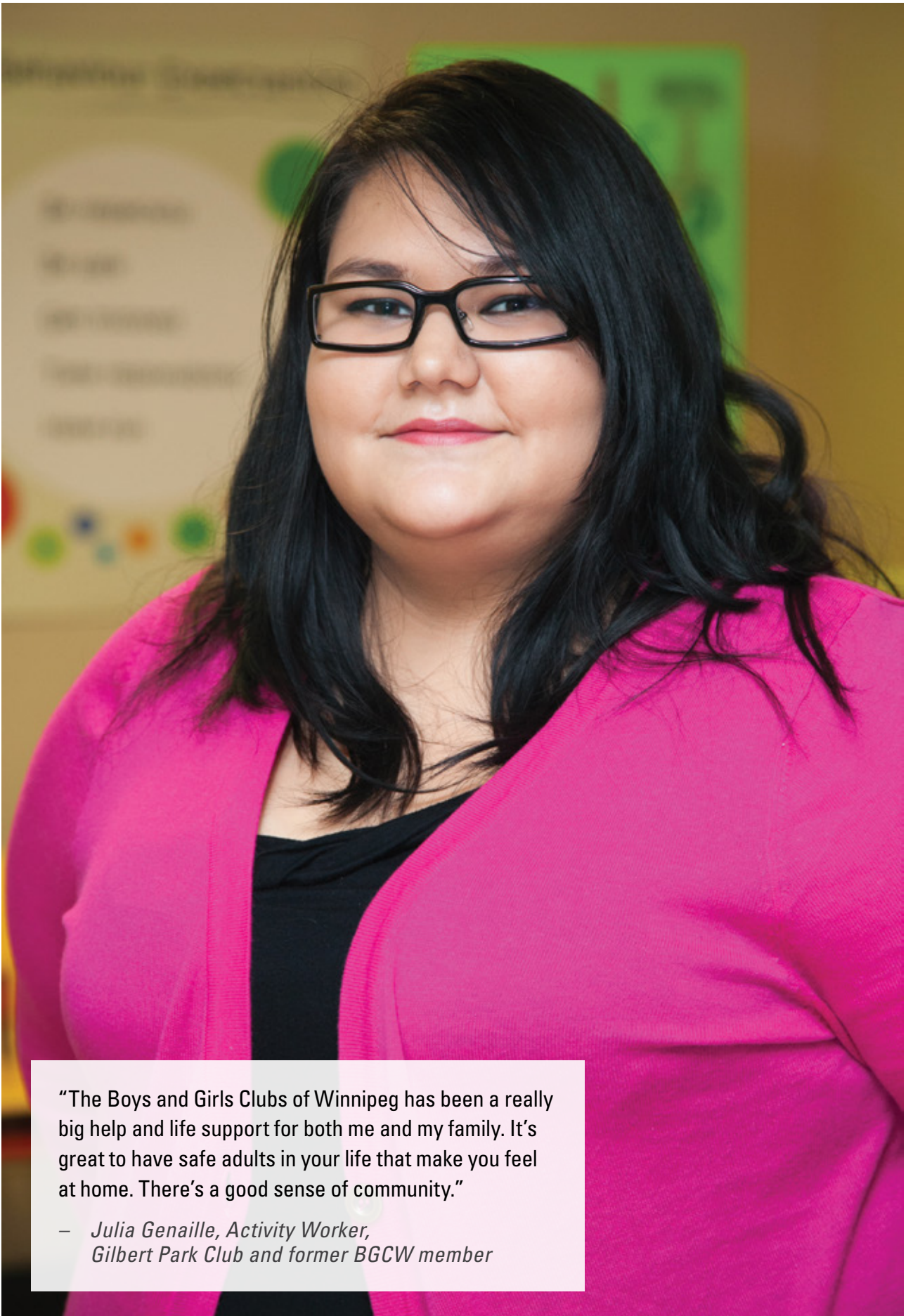

# Sport, Recreation and Physical Activity



The Sport, Recreation and Physical Activity program area promotes physical fitness, participation, positive use of leisure time, and the development of social and interpersonal skills.

This past summer, members from our Victor Mager Club had the opportunity to participate in Rona's Rascals Junior Golf Academy at Bridges Golf Course. This program provides young players with an easy introduction to the game of golf. As Larry Robinson, the director of golf at Bridges attests, "golf and its environment can have a very positive and nurturing effect on young people. I know it did for me."

To kick-off Canadian Tire's Jumpstart Red Ball month, some of our aspiring soccer stars were thrilled to meet four members of the Canadian Women's National Soccer Team - Kadeisha Buchanan, Ashley Lawrence, Adriana Leon and Josée Bélanger. Whether it's the chance to try a sport for the very first time or to continue with a favourite physical activity, Jumpstart makes it possible for all kids to participate.

Thanks to the Jays Care Foundation, our Rookie League members participated in a baseball clinic with Blue Jays alumni in August. Rookie League is a program that uses the game of baseball as a foundation to teach children the importance of team work, cooperation, and self-esteem. This safe and fun program continues to build healthy communities across Canada by breaking barriers to organized sport for more than 8,000 children and youth from coast to coast.

Our Carpathia Club had 14 youth participate in a Build-a-Bike program with W.R.E.N.C.H. this past summer. Through the program, youth learned about the maintenance and repair of a variety of bike parts including flat tires, gears, breaks, and axles. At the end of the six sessions, the youth received a helmet and lock from W.R.E.N.C.H. and were able to keep the bikes they repaired. Our participants were so excited about their bikes that they immediately went out for a bike ride. They also ride them regularly when coming to Club.

# Education and Career Development

The Education and Career Exploration program area enables youth to develop the skills and knowledge they need to help them in school and when finding employment.

Two of our career exploration initiatives, the Clean Machine Streets program and the Clean Machine Waterways program, once again had a productive and successful year. Over 30 youth participated in cleaning sidewalks as well as planting and weeding at parks throughout the city. These programs provided a first-time work experience for many of the participants.

Our Power Up! program participants also engaged in a number of fun educational activities this year, including how to package and mail a Pringles potato chip to themselves without it breaking en route. Power Up! is a cross-age mentoring program designed to help children and youth develop the skills, confidence, and motivation needed to study effectively on their own and become lifelong learners.

Our Youth Recreation Activity Worker Program had another successful year, with 12 students graduating from the 9-month program. An amazing statistic to note—100% of the graduates have found jobs, and four have decided to continue with post-secondary education! This program is a joint initiative of the Boys and Girls Clubs of Winnipeg and Red River College and offers students the necessary training and knowledge they need to make a difference in the lives of children and youth.

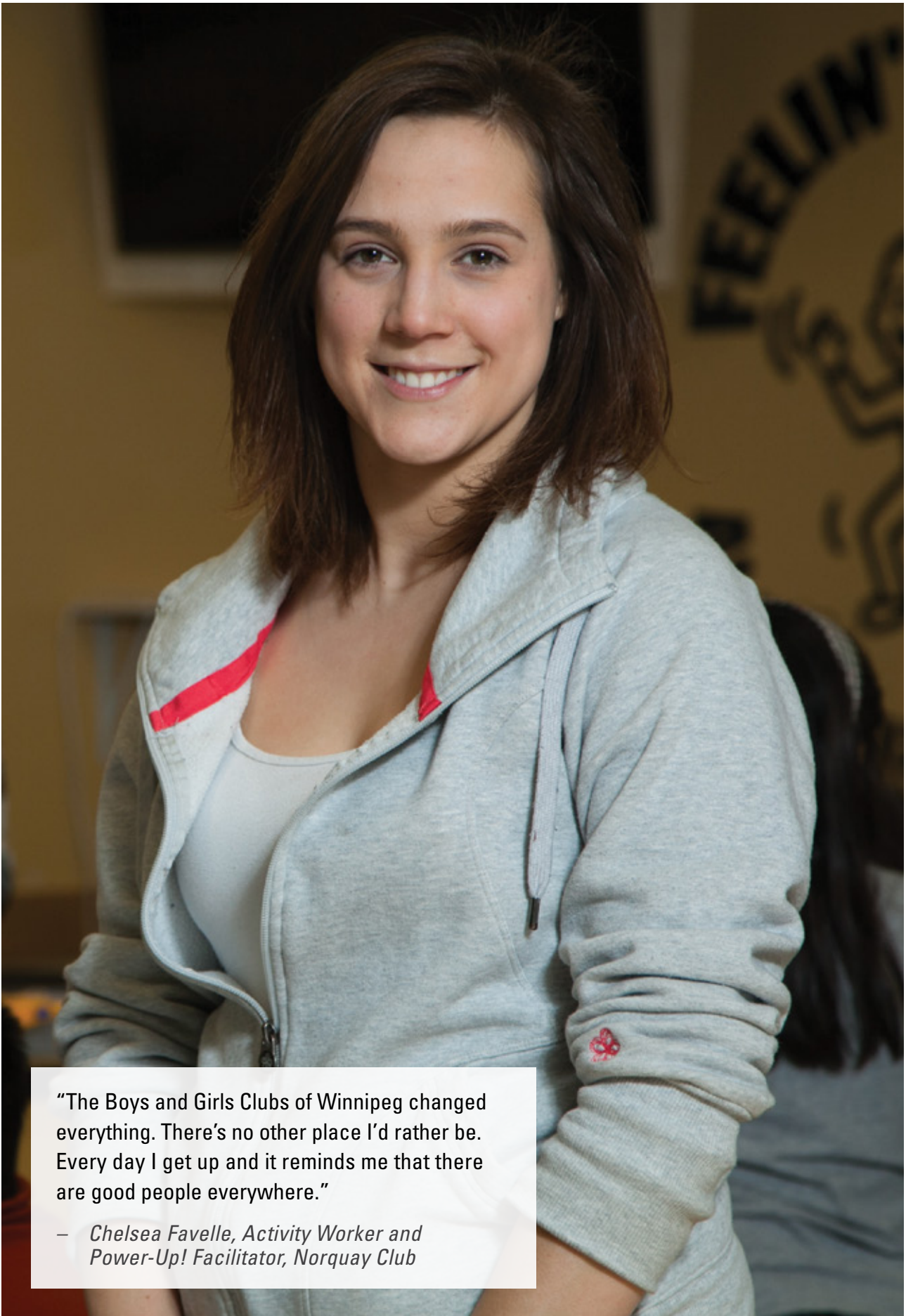
# Arts and Cultural Appreciation

The Arts and Cultural Appreciation area enables children and youth to engage in a variety of artistic and cultural activities that encourages creative expression and critical thinking.

Youth from our Sister MacNamara Club and instructors from the Broadway Neighbourhood Centre completed an exciting and interactive Just TV video project this year. Participants were involved in all facets of song concept, writing, recording and video production. Youth also created a fun hip hop dance that was featured in the video. This program offered newcomer youth a chance to share their experiences through music. Funding for this program was thanks to Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada's Newcomer Advancement Grant.

The Freight House Club Rap Program also introduced youth to a new creative outlet they will not soon forget while enhancing their confidence and expression of self. Taking place at Beacon's Field, participants were able to sit down with instructors and have creative discussions about song writing and creation. They also worked with studio equipment and recording software, construct instrumental beats, and best of all, record their vocals on music tracks they helped create. This project was made possible in partnership with Graffiti Art Programming and with the help of a grant from The Winnipeg Foundation.

# Health Awareness and Life Skills Development

The Health Awareness and Life Skills Development program area develops young people's capacity to engage in positive behaviour that nurtures their own well-being, set personal goals, and acquire the skills to live successfully as self-sufficient adults. Our proactive approach in addressing the issues young people face provides opportunities for them to develop practical skills for their future.



Looking for a babysitter? Look no further! In total, 41 kids from Carpathia, Sister MacNamara, Norquay, Gilbert Park, and Ryerson took part in a Basics for Babysitting course in 2014. The program is designed to instill confidence in students by providing comprehensive instruction around topics such as taking care of younger children, dealing with problems and emergencies, and basic first aid. Staff were trained to deliver the program thanks to the South Winnipeg Family Information Centre.

Nursing students from the University of Manitoba held a series of various clinics at our Gilbert Park Club over a period of nine weeks. They covered a variety of health and wellness topics such as hand washing, personal hygiene, illness prevention, and dental health. The kids especially liked applying the Glo Germ powder to their hands to see what germs they missed!



# Leadership and Service to Community

The Leadership and Service to Community area empowers youth to support and influence their Club and community, sustain meaningful relationships with others, and develop a positive self image.

Our Gilbert Park Club Keystone leadership program gave youth ages 14-18 the chance to plan summer activities based on their own interests and needs of their communities. As a finale to the program, participants took part in a 3-day canoe trip in Whiteshell where they had the opportunity to get outside and enjoy the natural environment. Members experienced tremendous growth in several capacities, such as developing leadership, teamwork, critical thinking, community development and all around life skills that pave the way for them to grow into successful and productive young adults.



# Other Programs and Services

The Boys and Girls Clubs of Winnipeg also manage a few programs that benefit youth and young adults. These are not club-based programs, but rather work to provide supports and opportunities to specific youth populations in Winnipeg.

## VOICES - Manitoba's Youth in Care

This year VOICES collaborated with Sarasvati Productions to put on a play called Giving Voice – a powerful, interactive theatrical journey exploring the timely issue of how youth experience the system of CFS. This was also an award-winning year for VOICES as they were named the winner of the Canadian Coalition for the Rights of Children Youth Voice Award. Marie Christian, VOICES Program Coordinator, was named the recipient of the 2014 Outstanding Achievement Award for Advocacy from the Child Welfare League of Canada.

## Youth Agencies Alliance (YAA)

This past summer, youth from YAA member agencies were asked the question, "what's in your brain?" Through brainstorming sessions and art workshops the youth were able to translate their thoughts, ideas, hopes and fears into artwork. Hosted at a ceartinc., the workshops were facilitated by artists from Art City, Graffiti Art Programming, and the North End Art Centre. This project was made possible thanks to support from United Way, The Winnipeg Foundation, Manitoba Children and Youth Opportunities (MB4 Youth) and Manitoba Tourism, Culture, Sport and Consumer Protection.



# Community Support

## Serving up a Childhood Classic for Kids

Thanks to the University of Manitoba's Chaplains' Association, Boys and Girls Clubs members were treated to 985 peanut butter and jam sandwiches during the 18th annual PB Jam.

Each year, students, staff, and alumni work alongside the association to assemble hundreds of PB&J sandwiches. Through generous donations from churches, synagogues, and local businesses, the Chaplaincy has made 34,190 peanut butter and jam sandwiches for Winnipeg Harvest and Boys and Girls Clubs since their start in 1997.

What started as small donations of PB&J sandwiches to our Victor Mager Club has now become a partnership that benefits all of 10 of our Clubs. These sandwiches are a delicious snack that provides the fuel our kids need to keep active during our after-school programs.

## Golf Program Bridges the Gap

Congratulations to Bridges Golf Course on winning the Canadian Professional Golfers Association of Manitoba Junior Leader of the Year Award for 2014 for the Boys and Girls Clubs – Big Brothers Big Sisters Golf Program. Through this program, Bridges was able to conduct over 20 youth golf clinics for the two organizations.

# CSI Given a Jumpstart

In 2014, with the help of Canadian Tire and Sport Manitoba, we introduced physical literacy as a new component of the CSI Summer Learning Program. For an hour a day, CSI students were encouraged to participate in what became known as Jumpstart Hour.

Physical literacy provides a solid foundation for children to develop skills, knowledge and confidence to participate in fundamental movement and sports activities.

Canadian Tire provided each site a sports bag with soccer balls, bean bags, skipping ropes, and other equipment the children could use during the Jumpstart Hour while Sport Manitoba provided training on physical literacy to our instructors.

On July 31, 2014 the first ever Winnipeg Jumpstart Games Day was held at the Waverley Soccer Complex. Over 1,000 children and staff celebrated their participation in physical literacy and the Jumpstart Hour during a day of fun activities. The day included a variety of stations where the children participated in games of capture the flag, relay races, parachute games, bouncy castles and water games.

Jazz on Wheels joined us at the event and provided entertainment during the BBQ lunch and Canadian Tire provided giveaways for each participating child.

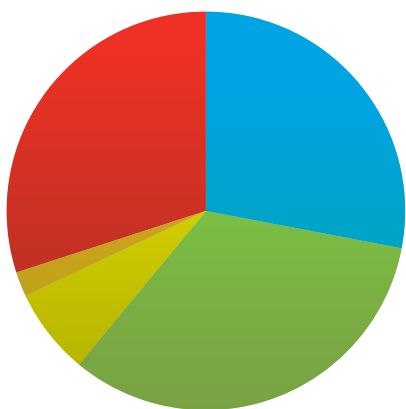

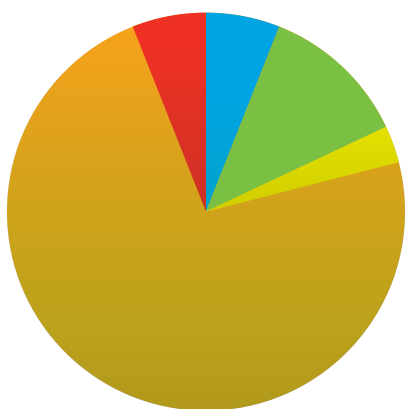

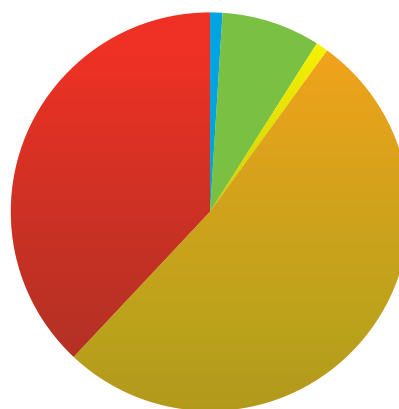
